Practice times will be available on Thursday July 23rd, 2020. The 2020 Canadian Championships is an Open Event for all IDBF member nations, clubs and their individual members. Standard registration fees apply.





LOCATION

Welland, Ontario, Canada is known as "The Rose City" for its beautiful rose gardens located within the city's parks. It is situated in the heart of the Niagara Region and is abundant with heritage, culture and community spirit.

Welland is located in a part of Canada that offers a unique and renowned natural environment. The Niagara escarpment is a major feature of the area; a 725km long ridge that extends throughout southern Ontario. Visitors enjoy the forested areas and waterfalls of the escarpment through world-class hiking and outdoor adventuring opportunities. Another spectacular feature of the Niagara region is the Niagara Parkway, a scenic drive from Fort Erie to Niagara-on-the-Lake. In a 1943 visit, Winston Churchill referred to the Parkway as "the prettiest Sunday afternoon drive in the world."

In addition to the abundance of parks, trails, gardens and beaches is the Region's most famous feature, Niagara Falls - one of the Great Wonder's of the World. The Falls are 57 meters high (180 feet) and has 168,000 cubic meters of water fall over its crest every minute.

REGATTA COURSE

WELLAND INTERNATIONAL FLATWATER CENTRE

The WIFC rivals top facilities in the world with infrastructure exceeding current international standards for hosting, accessibility, and pristine water conditions. It includes a top-quality start system to ensure a fair start and an international standard course with Albano type buoys.

The WIFC is located at the end of the 7.5km long Welland Recreational Waterway. With its basin-like characteristics the WIFC will be the perfect venue for this competition.

VENUE PROFILE

Address: Welland International Flatwater Centre (WIFC), 16 Townline Tunnel Rd., Welland ON

Width: 125 – 135 m wide

Depth: 9.2 depth over full distance

Sides: Uniform slope of 29 degree; docking facilities extend the length of the racing area for easy embarkation

Current: Negligible to none – scientifically measured and confirmed

Water Quality: Excellent quality freshwater - source of municipal drinking supply

Avg. Water Temp: 21 -24 Degrees Celsius in July

Additional: Sheltered from prevailing SW winds; paved paths are located on both sides of the course with full visibility of the race area for spectators, bikers or those who wish to rollerblade

All racing will take place in IDBF licensed Standard Dragon Boats (BuK).

DIVISION I & II

For Division I and II, all athletes must be paid DBC associates for the 2020 Dragon Boat Canada membership year in order to register for the Canadian Dragon Boat Championships.

EARLY BIRD DEADLINE MAY 15, 2020

A minimum of 8 athletes must be registered to the CDBC Team List at time of registration. Team Registration will be cancelled for any Team if payment for a minimum of 8 athletes is not received within 7 days of registration.

Complete Team Lists will not be required to be entered until July 17. th complete payment will be required no later than July 17th or registration will be void. Entry fees are non-transferable and non-refundable.

Please note that Club Names and Individual Athlete names will be sent to the merchandise provider on July 1st, 2020. Any individual or crew not entered by this date will not be included on any event merchandise.

Entry fees for registrations received on or before May 11th, 2018

- \$65.00 per individual for the first crew Premier, Senior Divisions (A, B and C), Blind and Partially Sighted (BPS) and Breast Cancer Survivor (BCS) divisions.
- \$35.00 Special Rate for Junior, U24 and University Division unlimited entry in all categories. Unlimited entry is available only to individuals registered first in Junior, U24 or University division. Otherwise unlimited entry is void and standard additional crew fees shall be levied.
- \$25.00 for each additional crew (Premier, Senior (A,B and C), BPS and BCS.

AFTER MAY 15, 2020

Individual registration fees will increase to:

- \$85.00 per individual for the first crew Premier, Senior, BPS and BCS
- \$55.00 Junior, U24 and University

IDBF Specification Dragon Boats (Standard) will be provided for the Championships.

Under the DBC Competition Regulations, participants in Division I and II are not required to wear PFDs when racing, unless the Chief Official so decides. This decision is solely at the discretion of the Chief Official and may be determined by the weather (e.g. Junior's, BPS required to wear PFDs).

Only IDBF Licensed 202a paddles may be used.

PFDs and paddles will be available at the regatta site. Availability may be limited so if the desire to use a PFD or paddle is known in advance, please book in advance. The booking form will be available in the next bulletin.
